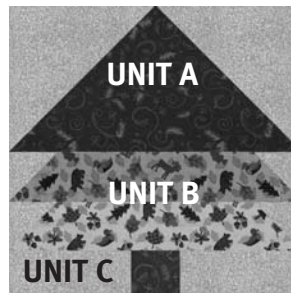

Yardage

LWOO 907 G	1 1/2 yard for Moon over the Mountain block and outer borders
LWOO 907 Z	3/8 yard for Moon over the Mountain blocks
LWOO 908 G	1 1/8 yard for horizontal sashing strips
LWOO 909 G	1/8 yard for Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 909 T	1/8 yard for Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 910 G	1 fat eighth (9" x 21") for Tree blocks and Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 911 G	1 fat eighth (9" x 21") for Tree blocks and Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 911 X	1/4 yard for Tree blocks and Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 912 X	1/2 yard for Moon over the Mountain blocks and Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 912 G	1 fat quarter (18" x 21") for Tree blocks and Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 912 I	1/2 yard for Tree blocks and binding
LWOO 912 Z	1/8 yard for Tree blocks and Bear's Paw blocks
LWOO 912 ZZ	3/8 yard for inner border
SAND 191 T	1/2 yard for Moon over the Mountain background
SAND 191 BG	1/2 yard for Tree block background
FWEA 208 E	1/4 yard for Bear's Paw blocks
BACKING	3 yards of your favorite LWOO fabric
TEAR-A-WAY STABILIZER	(3) 13" squares for Moon over the Mountain blocks

Tree Blocks



SAND 191 BG	cut (3) 6 7/8" squares; cut the squares once diagonally to yield (6) triangles (12) 2 1/2" squares (6) 2 1/2" x 5 3/4" rectangles
LWOO 912 Z	cut (3) 2" x 2 1/2" rectangles
LWOO 911 G	cut (1) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle
LWOO 911 X	cut (2) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles
LWOO 910 G	cut (1) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle
LWOO 912 I	cut (2) 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle
LWOO 912 G	cut (1) 13 1/4" square; cut the square twice diagonally to yield (4) triangles (1 will be extra)

Construction of Tree Blocks

1. Sew 6 7/8" blue triangles to the short sides of each green triangle to make unit A.
2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 2 1/2" blue square. Place a marked square on both ends of a 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle, making sure the marked lines are angled toward the center of the rectangle. Sew on the drawn line and trim the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press the triangles open. In the same manner, sew marked squares to the remaining 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles. Make a total of six of these units. Referring to the photo, sew the units together in pairs to make unit B.
3. Sew a 2" x 2 1/2" light brown rectangle between two 2 1/2" x 5 3/4" blue rectangles to make unit C.
4. Sew one A unit, one B unit, and one C unit together as shown to complete the block. Make three blocks.

Moon Over the Mountain Blocks

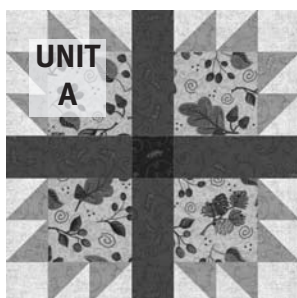


- SAND 191 T** cut (3) 13" squares
LWOO 907 Z cut (3) triangles; 13" wide on the longest side and 8 3/4" tall, making sure there's a bear in each triangle (mountains)
LWOO 912 X cut (3) 6 3/4" diameter circles (moons)

Construction of Moon Blocks

Referring to the photo, place a moon in the center of each 13" square and then place a mountain on top, aligning the bottom edges. Center and pin a piece of stabilizer on the back of the block. Machine appliqué each moon and mountain using a zigzag or satin stitch. Once the appliqué is completed, remove the stabilizer and trim the blocks to measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Make three blocks.

Bear's Paw Blocks



- FWEA 208 E** cut (24) 2 5/8" squares and (12) 2 1/4" squares
LWOO 912 X (24) 2 5/8" squares
LWOO 911 G cut (4) 4" squares
LWOO 911 X cut (4) 4" squares
LWOO 910 G cut (4) 4" squares
LWOO 912 G cut (3) 2" squares
LWOO 909 G cut (4) 2" x 5 3/4" rectangles
LWOO 909 T cut (4) 2" x 5 3/4" rectangles
LWOO 912 Z cut (4) 2" x 5 3/4" rectangles

Construction of Bear's Paw Blocks

1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each 2 5/8" cream square. Layer a marked square with a gold square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the drawn line. Cut the squares apart on the drawn line and press the seam allowances toward the gold triangles. Make 48 triangle squares.
2. For unit A, lay out four triangle squares, one 2 1/4" cream square, and one 4" green square as shown. Sew the triangle squares together in pairs. Sew the triangle pairs, the cream square, and the green square together in rows, then sew the rows together to complete the unit. Make four matching units for each block.
3. Lay out four matching A units, four matching 2" x 5 3/4" rectangles and one 2" dark green square in a nine-patch arrangement. Sew the pieces together in rows, then sew the rows together to complete the block. Make three blocks.

Quilt Construction

- LWOO 908 G** cut (2) 3 3/4" x 36 1/2" sashing strips, centering a bear stripe in the middle of each strip
LWOO 912 ZZ cut (5) 2" x 42" inner-border strips
LWOO 907 G cut (2) 5" x 48 1/2" strips (top/bottom) and (2) 5" x 46" strips (sides for outer border)
LWOO 912 I cut (6) 2 1/4" x 42" binding strips

1. Referring to the photo, sew the blocks in three rows of three blocks each. Sew the block rows and two sashing strips together, alternating them as shown.
2. Sew the 2" - wide brown inner-border strips together end to end. From this strip, cut two 43" - long side border strips and two 39 1/2" - long strips for the top and bottom inner borders. Sew the strips to the sides and then to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
3. Sew the 5" - wide outer-border strips to the sides and then to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
4. Layer the quilt top with batting and backing; baste. Quilt as desired. Bind edges. Don't forget a label!
